COMMUNICATIONS: Clerk of the Board, Elizabeth Bozzelli reads correspondence received from Donna Cifichello praising the dedicated care given her mother, Phyllis Cifichello, resident of the Crest Haven Nursing and Rehabilitation Center for 4 years prior to her death on January 3, 2017.

REPORTS:

- 1) COUNTY ENGINEER: Dale Foster had no report.
- 2) COUNTY COUNSEL: Jim Arsenault had no report.
- 3) COUNTY TREASURER: Francine Springer had no report.

FREEHOLDER REPORTS:

- 1) FREEHOLDER MOREY: Freeholder Morey met the new Executive Director of the Delaware River & Bay Authority, Tom Cook at a recent luncheon meeting. A follow up meeting was planned within the next few weeks with an invitation for the rest of the Board to meet Mr. Cook at that time.

Commanding Officer, Captain Gibbons, TRACEN extended an invitation to the Board to visit the base, have lunch and a personal tour of one of the new Fast Response Cutters (FRC).

- 2) FREEHOLDER PIERSON: Freeholder Pierson reported through Jan. 31, 2017 a total of 255 people were touched and placed as a result of “Code Blue” being called for extreme cold weather. Around half of that number were individuals who had been placed previously.

He talked about Atlantic City Electric’s new free phone app. which allows people to check and report power outages and blown street lights quickly and easily.

The Department of Health and Human Services received a \$25,000 grant award from Delta Dental of New Jersey again this year to be used by individuals 60 years of age and older without access to dental care.

The Health Department reported receiving Cancer Education Early Detection (CEED) grant money for women, 40-60 years old, men, 50-64 years old, and African American men, 40 years and older. Also noted for 2016, 1212 food inspections throughout the county, 36 rabies submissions, and reviewed 283 plans, repairs and alterations to septic systems.

The Department of Community Affairs under Pat Devaney reported county substance abuse treatment figures for 2016 not available to date. In 2015, there were 2,239 admissions, 59% identified as heroin and other opiates. On the state level there were 69,744 admissions with 47% identified as heroin or other opiates. Heroin continues to dominate our problem here in Cape May County.

Kim Guadagno, Lieutenant Governor has been asked to be the guest speaker this year for the county at the Memorial Day Ceremony held at the Veteran's Cemetery.

- 3) FREEHOLDER HAYES: The freeholder attended the Cape May County School Board Association Security Summit at Ocean City High School where she represented the Freeholder Board. A presentation was given by the New Jersey State Police with the freeholder and other law enforcement officials from around the county speaking on current security efforts in the schools.

She gave testimony before a New Jersey Senate subcommittee on a bill presented by Senator Whalen regarding boating and dredging, particularly with marinas and regulations that could be scaled back. The bill passed and would be put before the entire senate.

She attended a breakfast sponsored by the Women's Commission of Atlantic County. The purpose being a fundraiser for the Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Program. The initiative's goal is for more young girls to become interested in these areas of study. The panel of speakers at the breakfast were individuals successfully working in these fields, sharing their stories.

- 5) FREEHOLDER THORNTON: Director Thornton and Office of Emergency Management Director Marty Pagliughi met with a group regarding a county-wide alert system to be used for emergency and crisis situations. One of the issues included in the discussion was about location and towers when using cell phones. This technology is being worked on for safer outcomes.

Freeholders Hayes and Thornton attended the New Jersey Association of Counties (NJAC) Reorganization Meeting and swearing in of President Heather Simmons. The focus was on counties working together on challenges.

The upcoming Cape May County 325th Anniversary Celebration is being planned and discussed. A bottle of wine is being produced to commemorate the event along with other products to feature the county.

Freeholders Pierson and Thornton have been meeting with veterans organizations discussing ways to bring more veterans services to the county.
