2. Resolution applying to New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety for Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Grant No. V-05-17 for a period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020 in the total amount of \$591,363.00.
(This Resolution authorizes application to the State for a total amount of \$591,363.00 (Federal Agency \$338,340.00, In Kind Match \$253,023.00) for the period of 7/1/2019 to 6/30/2020.)
