1. Recognition of student volunteers for the County Reorganization Meeting

2. MHADA Board Recognition

Commissioner Pierson first acknowledged Human Services Director, Pat Devaney for her presence on the Mental Health Alcohol and Drug Abuse (MHADA) Board. He stressed the fact that a lot of the MHADA board members had been on the board for years and the work was completely volunteer. He continued by acknowledging Kyle Lindholm of Upper Township, Katie Faldetta, Executive Director of Cape Assist and The Branches Outreach Center. Both individuals and the organization were recognized for making a positive contribution to the area of behavioral and mental health and improving lives in the County. Commissioner Pierson named Sandra Lockhart and Terri Mascione for their dedication and support of the Branches initiative over the last few years. He added the agency would continue to expand under the leadership of the new Executive Director, Maria Elena Hallion. Photographs with the Board followed.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS:

1) COMMISSIONER MOREY: Mr. Morey reminded everyone of the 2022 Smart Growth Award that had been given for the Pacific Avenue Redevelopment Project. New Jersey's Future, the organization that awarded for Smart Growth innovation, were in town last week, bringing with them a plaque commemorating the plan that would help connect neighborhoods and restore a vibrant downtown in Wildwood. Commissioner Morey made the plaque available to the County Administrator for display. Uniquely, he said the plaque was made from tile and put together by a developmentally disabled group of women from Atlantic City.

He spoke with his Atlantic County Improvement Authority (ACIA) contacts, he said. They let him know they expected to be out to bid by next week for the Tech Village Phase II project.

2) COMMISSIONER PIERSON: Mr. Pierson attended the following meeting/and or events: the Military Order of World Wars meeting in Sea Girt; the Coast Guard Foundation fundraiser held at Fins Bar & Grille in the City of Cape May; the Cape May County Coast Guard Foundation meeting and the Southern NJ Commissioners Association (SNJCA) meeting in Somers Point.

3) COMMISSIONER BULAKOWSKI: Mr. Bulakowski looked forward to serving the constituents, he said. He recognized former Director Gerald Thornton on his retirement from his long career of public service, conceding his were big shoes to fill. He congratulated Director Desiderio and Vice-Director Hayes on their new seats. He also congratulated all the elected officials from the sixteen municipalities and looked forward to working with them all.

He attended the Cape May County Chamber business meeting in January along with Commissioner Hayes. Affordable housing was the main topic of discussion.

He attended the Martin Luther King Jr. celebration in Ocean City with Commissioner Hayes. Congressman Van Drew and Assemblyman McClellan were there with Mayor Jay Gillian and many other elected officials. He concluded it was a great ceremony and an honor to be in attendance.

4) COMMISSIONER HAYES: Ms. Hayes thanked her colleagues for putting her in the position of Vice-Director. The Reorganization meeting and celebration after were wonderful, she stated. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves.

Regarding the January CMC Chamber of Commerce meeting and presentation by Dr. Oliver Cooke, Associate Professor of Economics with Stockton University, she offered to share the PowerPoint of the meeting. It detailed the current status of the regional economy in South Jersey, the near-term outlook of the regional economy and the regional economy's largest opportunities/challenges. The recording was available if any of the board members would like to see it. It possessed a wealth of information, she remarked.

She attended a ribbon cutting for a new business in Ocean City, the Beehive Salon. She related how much she was impressed by the modern, seemingly very fun salon, owned and operated by a local young woman.

The commissioner finished her report by highlighting the proficiency of one of the many capable county employees. She read an e-mail sent by an individual that lived on her block coincidentally, in Ocean City. He wrote thanking her for the referral to the Surrogate's Office, concerning estate matters on the death of his mother. He described the experience in the correspondence. He was very thankful for the assistance provided by Karen Naile, Acting Surrogate for the county. In the end a positive outcome with the probate court was obtained, she said.

5) COMMISSIONER DESIDERIO: The Director and remainder of the board had attended several reorganization meetings held around the county over the past few weeks, he reported. He stressed that working together with the local municipalities was extremely important, and county government would continue to do so for the benefit of everyone, but especially for the taxpayers and citizens of the county.

Sam Kelly, Cape May Court House addressed Director Desiderio specifically, due to his role as the new director of the Board. He indicated several reasons why he believed a homeless shelter was needed in Cape May County. He wanted the county to provide a homeless shelter for those people in need of comprehensive services, additional to a place to sleep and a hot meal.

Carl Hober, Rio Grande, owner of the family fun park, Offshore Adventure Golf in Rio Grande described to the Board an issue he was experiencing with an access road on the back of his property there. He had used the road over the last 20 years without a problem but currently there was a flooding concern with no current drainage strategies in place. To help him, he asked if the county could address the Railroad Avenue flooding issue.

Janet Brino, Cape May Court House expressed her concern regarding county senior citizens that utilize the services of Fare Free Transportation. She loved Fare Free, she commented, but the seniors needed more help than they were getting from the county. There were some glitches.

Administrator Kevin Lare pointed out to the Board they would approve on the agenda tonight, a resolution to conduct a feasibility study of Fare Free Transportation, its operations and efficiencies.
