COMMUNICATIONS: None.

REPORTS:

1) COUNTY ENGINEER:

Bob Church briefed the Board pertaining to the sinkhole on Bayshore Road at the Fishing Creek culvert crossing, which was the reason he was absent from the commissioner meetings on March 9th. Ultimately, the road was closed, and a detour established until emergency repairs could be completed, possibly by the first week of April, if all went according to plan, he stated.

He gave an update on the following projects: Breakwater Road drainage project, Ingram’s Thorofare re-decking project and Bay Avenue paving project in Ocean City.

He informed the Board that the County had been awarded a \$500,000.00 grant from the South Jersey Transportation Organization (SJTPO) for the signal synchronization along 34th Street in Ocean City.

In addition to the SJTPO award, Atlantic City had been unable to use their urbanized project money for Fiscal Year 2021 because their project was not advanced enough, he explained. That surplus amount of \$700,000.00 was being turned over to Cape May County for use on the Ocean Drive in Avalon project, which was shovel ready. Similarly, some COVID money earmarked to be used in an urbanized zone, was being

divided up between Atlantic and Cape May Counties. Possibly Cape May County could receive all the money if Atlantic County's project was not ready to go. Bob explained he would have the project federalized first, and then the allotment could be used towards the Landis Avenue project, from 69th Street to the Townsends Inlet Bridge.

3) COUNTY TREASURER: No report.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS:

1) COMMISSIONER MOREY:

Mr. Morey drew everyone's attention to Res. 229-21 on tonight's agenda. The resolution endorsed the advancement of the Ocean Drive (CR621) Upgrades and Bridge Improvements into preliminary and final engineering phases. This was a giant step forward, as part of implementation stage of the comprehensive bridge plan; something to be encouraged and enthused about, he indicated. The RFP process could take 2 to 3 months to put together but ultimately should be ready to go out to bid by September.

2) COMMISSIONER PIERSON:

Mr. Pierson reported his participation in numerous virtual meetings since the March 9th Commissioner meetings: Cape May County COVID Taskforce, the Homeless Taskforce Advisory Board, NJAC Mandatory COVID-19 vaccine and testing, Upper Township Business Association, Coast Guard Foundation Board, NJAC Medication Assistance Treatment for incarcerated individuals and a discussion on housing for homeless veterans.

He informed that he had sent out the COVID Actions updated list to fellow board members earlier today. To date 50,000 doses of the vaccine had been distributed to both county and non-county residents. Vaccine from the State was still insufficient to cover need. In response to a question by Commissioner Director Thornton, he replied that the homebound inoculation program was intended to start yesterday. Currently, "Meals on Wheels" recipients were getting vaccinated along with homeless individuals.

3) COMMISSIONER HAYES:

Ms. Hayes reported participating in several different events over the past two weeks. She took part in her first podcast ever, entitled Lift Every Voice. She recorded for a WOND radio show hosted by David Spatz, updating the audience on current events taking place at the Park & Zoo. Park Director, Ed Runyon and Veterinarian, Dr. Alex Ernst were interviewed for the segment too. An upcoming Zoological Society fundraiser, soliciting money for the construction of new exhibits to house toucans, kangaroos and emus, was the main topic of the segment. Additionally, the commissioner logged on to NJAC's seminar on medication assisted treatment of the incarcerated, and the Cape May County Chamber of Commerce monthly meeting featuring Commissioner Director Thornton's State of the County.

4) COMMISSIONER DESIDERIO:

Mr. Desiderio reported that he had also attended a variety of virtual meetings the last 2 weeks. Moreover, he remarked that on March 14th he had the opportunity to attend a nice event at VFW Post 1963. The Auxiliary donated different items to the United States Air Force 78th Air Refueling Squadron (the 78th), which operates out of Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst in Burlington County. The donated items included

toiletries and personal care items as well as snacks, ranging from Girl Scout cookies, candy and homemade beef jerky – all donated by Auxiliary members and veterans from Post 1963.

5) COMMISSIONER THORNTON:

Director Thornton presented the “State of the County” virtually for the CMC Chamber of Commerce on March 18th and conference calls with the State of New Jersey, now down to 2 days per week as opposed to the daily calls at the start of the pandemic. He continued to receive kind words of acknowledgement regarding the professionalism and efficiency of the staff at the Avalon vaccination site, he stated.
