# REPORTS:

- 1) COUNTY ENGINEER: Bob Church gave his report which detailed projects in various stages of completion. He updated the Board on the progress of the Woodbine Roundabout, repairs to the 96<sup>th</sup> Street Bridge in Stone Harbor, Corson's Tavern Road Phase II, and the three federal aid projects.
- 2) COUNTY COUNSEL: Jeff Lindsay had no report.
- 3) COUNTY TREASURER: Brittany Smith had no report.

## FREEHOLDER REPORTS:

# 1) FREEHOLDER MOREY:

Mr. Morey acknowledged Jeffrey Pierson with the announcement that he had been elected Chairman of the Coast Guard Community Foundation. Mr. Morey had served as the founding chairman beginning in 2015. He spoke about Cape May County's designation as a Coast Guard Community and Cape May being dubbed the hometown of the Coast Guard. The relationship between the Coast Guard and the people of Cape May County had really grown over the past five years due to the efforts of the foundation, he noted. He recognized Mr. Pierson for the recent endeavor to have Cape May County redesignated as a Coast Guard Community.

Mr. Pierson thanked Will Morey for the opportunity to take the lead. He gave kudos for what transpired already, recognizing Mike Couch for his contributions and Marie Hayes for her time on the board.

The freeholder reminded that in December 2019 he has submitted on behalf of Public Works, the Bridge Commission, Engineering, and others, a Comprehensive Bridge Construction-Replacement Plan to be reviewed by the Board. In June 2020 he had asked those involved to refresh and send him an updated document. The 15-year plan, substantially like the original document, was sent out to the Board for their consideration and possible adoption at the next Freeholder Meeting. It was a living document subject to amendments and revisions along the way, he commented.

# 2) FREEHOLDER PIERSON:

Mr. Pierson informed the County had finally received five contract tracers from the State of New Jersey. We have fifteen in house, so that gives us a total of nineteen contact tracers here in the county, he stated.

He recognized Kevin Thomas and his department for all they have been doing with COVID-19 and now with the water and beaches added to daily tasks.

Two more drive-thru coronavirus testing clinics were scheduled at the Cape May County Public Safety Training Center. A test date and time could be scheduled online at CompleteCare.org. Turn out had been extremely low at the test site, he noted.

## 3) FREEHOLDER HAYES:

Ms. Hayes reported that most of the damage to the County Park had already been taken care of. The park closed for a few days to complete the clean up effort. The storm did a lot of damage to the trees, but everything was going well now.

This year, the Fare Free Rodeo was being cancelled because of the coronavirus, she informed. All competitions were being cancelled for 2020, at both the State and National levels.

She complimented Bob Church on the completed Woodbine Roundabout.

## 4) FREEHOLDER DESIDERIO:

Mr. Desiderio congratulated Jeff Pierson on his appointment as Chairman of the Coast Guard Community Foundation. He thanked and acknowledged Will Morey for a job well done and all that had been accomplished over the past five years. The recognition of the Coast Guard in the community had been achieved in a great manner, he stated.

# 5) FREEHOLDER THORNTON:

Director Thornton commended Will Morey for his work on the Coast Guard Community Foundation. He congratulated Jeff Pierson for now taking over the role.

The Bridge Plan Review would be looked at, he advised Freeholder Morey.

The contact tracers were a very important component of the fight against coronavirus, he noted. But he heard that people had been resistant to disclose information regarding others that they had been around. He acknowledged all the employees for doing a wonderful job for the County.
